Note by the playwright Deirdre Kinahan

OUTRAGE is my third full length play commemorating Ireland's revolutionary wars. WILD SKY (commissioned by Meath Arts Office) explored the world, ideals and circumstance that radicalised a generation and took them to the streets. EMBARGO (commissioned by Dublin Port, Fishamble & Irish Rail) looks at civil militancy and the personal cost of war while OUTRAGE turns attention exclusively to the experience of women during this period and the huge contribution they made to Ireland's fight. I also wrote a short piece for the Abbey Theatre commemorating the life of Jane Boyle, murdered by British Soldiers on Bloody Sunday, 1920 and cannot emphasise the extraordinary privilege it feels for me as a playwright to have had a voice in Ireland's looking back, in Ireland's honest examination of our bloody birth.

OUTRAGE is the story of two sisters, Alice & Nell, who are deeply engaged and viscerally active throughout the entire period of revolution yet find themselves at a crossroads when the country descends into faction and civil war implodes. For me, this play is about narrative, about how the story of our past is manipulated because history is always written by the victor and history is invariably written by men. I found it fascinating when researching the role of women in Ireland's revolution that many of them worked in the realm of propaganda, in writing war bulletins, pamphlets, leaflets, slogans yet now, one hundred years on, their contribution is widely unrecognised, widely unknown. Women fought at the very heart of the movement from the get-go, they weren't simply making sandwiches or rolling bandages but participated fully in every aspect of the Irish wars. OUTRAGE is therefore inspired by the true testimony of three revolutionary Irish women you have probably never heard of; Mary Flannery Woods, Brigid O'Mullane and Kathleen McKenna. It also revolves around a real-life event which took place in 1923 in Kerry where two women who supported the anti-treaty faction were violently assaulted by Irish Free State soldiers so reputing the notion that Ireland's wars were somehow holy and arguing that gender based violence played as much a part in the Irish struggle as it does is in all wars.

Yet OUTRAGE is not a history lesson, it is a play and so attempts to get in and under the grass-root experience of ordinary Irish people as they try to negotiate a life in the heat of that momentous change. Alice, Nell and PJ are our ghosts. They are us. Their violence, hope, guilt, love and torment lives on in the heart of us. But perhaps if we recognise that, if we face the true nature of our own revolution, we can heal.

Biographies

Deirdre Kinahan is an award-winning playwright. She is a member of Aosdána, Ireland's elected affiliation of outstanding artists. Deirdre collaborates with artists and theatres all over the world, is literary associate to Meath County Council and has a large canon of regularly produced plays to her credit and is published by Nick Hern Books.

Best Known Plays include: The Saviour, The Unmanageable Sisters, Rathmines Road, Moment, Halcyon Days, Bogboy, Hue & Cry, Spinning and her Irish Revolutionary Trilogy Wild Sky, Embargo and Outrage.

Deirdre works predominantly with the Abbey Theatre, Landmark Productions and Fishamble: The New Play Company in Ireland but also collaborates with theatres in the UK, Europe and America. Recent works include *The Saviour* for Landmark Productions & Irish Repertory Theatre NYC 2023, *An Old Song Half Forgotten* for the Abbey Theatre & Sofft productions 2023, *TEMPESTA* Sugarglass Theatre/Cork Midsummer Festival 2024, *In the Middle of the Fields* for Solas Nua Washington DC 2021, *The Visit* for Draiocht & Dublin Theatre Festival 2021/22, *Bloody Yesterday* 2022 for Glassmask Theatre.

Deirdre has a number of new Theatre and Screen projects in development, currently under commission to Staatstheater Mainz in Germany, Fishamble in Dublin and NOMAD touring group. She also has years of experience as a producer and enjoys curating or participating in multi-genre artistic projects for Meath County Council and other national festivals/events.

He has been nominated three times for the Irish Times Theatre Award for Best Sound Design. He also composes music and sound design for radio, TV and video games. He was composer and sound designer for Mr Wall on RTÉJr which was shortlisted for an IMRO Radio Award in the 2018 drama category. Game titles include *Curious George, Curious about Shapes and Colors, Jelly Jumble, Too Many Teddies, Dino Dog* and *Leonardo and His Cat.* TV credits include sound design for 16 letters (Independent Pictures/RTE) and SFX editing and foley recording for *Centenary* (RTE).

Gavin Kostick works with new writers for theatre through a variety of courses, script development workshops and award-winning schemes as Literary Manager at Fishamble. Gavin is also an award-winning playwright. His works have been produced nationally and internationally. Favourite works for Fishamble include *The Ash Fire, The Flesh Addicts and The End of The Road*. Works for other companies include This is What We Sang for Kabosh, *Fight Night, The Games People Play* and *At the Ford* for RISE Productions and *Gym Swim Party* with Danielle Galligan in co-production with The O'Reilly Theatre. He wrote the libretto for the opera *The Alma Fetish* composed by Raymond Deane, performed at the National Concert Hall. He has recently completed a new version of *The Odyssey*, supported by Kilkenny Arts Festival.
